# Goals



BUILDING STRONG

- Resolve items at lowest level
- Maximize resources to deliver necessary level of data for agencies to determine compliance with rules and regulations
- Allow for baseline data event this year



# Stakeholders



BUILDING STRONG

- Stakeholders – Levels of Organization to be Determined

  - USACE
  - NMFS
  - USFWS
  - EPA
  - FDEP

# Resolution Scheme



BUILDING STRONG

- Interagency Working Group (IWG) to identify issues while continuing to work monitoring plan
- Individual IWG member(s) with identified issue will provide issue/resolution document to all IWG 1<sup>st</sup> Line Supervisors for consideration
- Weekly 1<sup>st</sup> Line Supervisors calls instituted to review and discuss overall progress and to resolve documented issue identified by IWG
  - 1<sup>st</sup> Line Supervisors may initiate IWG calls to gain more information if necessary
  - Additional documentation may be necessary for elevation purposes



# Resolution Scheme



BUILDING STRONG

- Bi-weekly 2<sup>nd</sup> Line Supervisor calls instituted to update monitoring plan progress and review/resolve issue where 1<sup>st</sup> Line Supervisors required additional assistance (issue now 14 days old)
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Line Supervisors will initiate internal and external communications to acquire appropriate information to resolve issue within 2 additional weeks (Next call)
- If issue can not be resolved within 30 days, 3<sup>rd</sup> Line Supervisors will resolve issue or provide alternatives to satisfy compliance.



# Resolution Scheme



BUILDING STRONG

- If identified issue requires legal opinion, then IWG will hold that portion of the Interagency Monitoring Plan for the opinion.
- If the proposed issue is contrary to an agency's legal responsibilities, IWG will be notified to work alternatives to that particular issue to satisfy the agency with issue
