
LEGEND

- Auxiliary landing zone (no vehicles permitted)



TUTTLE CREEK LAKE

ORV Area Wheeling Guide

Thank you for choosing Tuttle Creek Lake for your off-road experience. We hope your visit is safe and enjoyable. The following list of rules and tips are provided to assist you during your visit. Not all rules are listed, for a full list refer to Title 36. A copy of Title 36 is posted on the bulletin board or can be obtained from Park Rangers, or 24/7 from the project office entryway. Questions can be directed to a Park Ranger or the project office.

What to Expect

- There is no permit or fee to use the park or Area. (see "Special Activities" for event permits)
- The Area includes 310 "open ride" acres, with no designated trails. The most worn-in trails are shown on the map (see reverse).
- Trails are not maintained and largely inaccessible to first responders. Users should have the right equipment and skills for the terrain. Use of the area is at your own risk.
- Some obstacles include: narrow trails with cross slopes and blind turns. Steep hill climbs and rock crawls with ledges and boulders. Thick, sucking mud holes and water fords. Conditions will vary.
- Modifications to stock vehicles are not mandatory to use the area, but failure to have the right equipment and skills for the terrain could result in vehicle damage and personal injury or death.
- Equipment typically used at The Area can include: aggressive tires, brush guards and skidplates, winches & tow straps, improved suspension and shocks, locking differentials, snorkels, roll cages, 5-point harnesses, etc.



Rules & Regs



RESPECTED ACCESS IS OPEN ACCESS
Follow the rules. Keep the Area open!

1. The Area is open for day use only. Area hours are sunrise to sunset. No camping or overnight use.
2. Alcohol is prohibited in the Area.
3. The Area is open to all motorized and non-motorized use, not limited to: trucks, Jeeps, buggies, side-by-sides (UTVs), ATVs, motorcycles, mountain bikes, and hikers (no equestrian use). Look out for others!
4. D.O.T. approved helmets must be worn by all riders of ATVs, cycles, and other vehicles lacking protective roll-bars.
5. One rider per vehicle (i.e. ATV/motorcycle), unless otherwise designed by the manufacturer.
6. Motorized vehicles are not permitted beyond the riding area (see map). The boundary is designated by yellow blazes, signs, and posts. It is your responsibility to know the boundary location - regardless if a sign or barrier is present.
7. Vehicles are prohibited within 100 yards of the lakeshore. The lake fluctuates and will change the size and shape of the riding area from what is shown on maps.

Vehicle extractions are expensive! Save your wallet and your ego. Bring the right equipment for the conditions.



Poor judgment is dangerous to you and others. Wheel responsibly!



8. No streambed riding. Use established crossings.
9. Staging area speed limit is 10 MPH. No excessive revving or exhaust, exhibition, reckless, or otherwise negligent driving. Activities which degrade the surface are prohibited (donuts, drifting, burnouts, etc.).
10. Fires must be confined to pedestal / personal grills. No ground or open fires! Leave hot coals in area grills—not trash cans.
11. Fireworks are prohibited at all times.
12. Loaded firearms and other projectile firing devices (bows, sling shots, paintball / pellet guns, etc.) are not allowed in the Area. No hunting permitted.
13. Pets must be kept on a leash (six feet or less), caged, or physically restrained at all times. Do not place chains around trees. Do not leave pets unattended. Loud and continuous barking will not be tolerated. Cleanup immediately after your pet.
14. Keep Area free of trash and litter. Deposit all trash in cans provided prior to departure. Do not leave automotive fluids, tires, and parts in the Area—take them with you.

Special Activities



Activities which are not normally engaged in by users on a day-to-day basis, impact or restrict use by others, or otherwise significantly impact the Area (as determined by Park Rangers) require a special event permit. These activities can include, but are not limited to: competitive events, promotional trail rides/jamborees, and/or fundraising events. Applications for special events must be requested 30 days in advance.

Trail Etiquette



- Obey all signage and do not travel beyond barriers.
- Support the off-road community: respect others, look out for one another, and stop to help.
- Be prepared—have the right equipment and supplies for the conditions. Travel with others.
- Mind your dust—especially in staging areas. Slow down!
- Leave plenty of room between vehicles—especially when navigating obstacles and climbing hills.
- Don't stop on blind curves or in the middle of the trail. Use a spotter for steep inclines or places where you can't pass or backup safely.
- Vehicles traveling uphill have right-of-way. Back up or pull over.
- Ride on established trails. Green space controls erosion, reduces dust, provides visual breaks, shade, and prolongs the overall life of the area.
- Plan ahead and refrain from riding on muddy trails to reduce erosion, trail widening, and deepening.
- Pack it in, pack *more* out—we appreciate your help picking up trailside litter!
