

# Camping Information

## Kanopolis Lake – Corps of Engineers



### Site Limits

#### Maximum Camping Units per site:

Campsites are limited to 8 people including 1 wheeled unit\* and 2 tents, or 3 tents. Designated double sites are allowed a maximum 16 people, 2 wheeled units and 4 tents, or 6 tents. Tents are limited to adjacent turf capacity off gravel pad as to not encroach on adjacent campsite turf and pad.

\* A "wheeled unit" is defined as an RV, motor-home, pop-up camper, pickup camper, or van and is used as a primary camping unit.

Paid overnight campers that are exempt from Venango Day Use & Beach Area fees.

### Peak Season Fees (1 MAY-30 SEP)

*Offseason Fees are \$10/night for utility sites*

Day Use Shelters	\$20/day (8AM-10PM), maximum 50 people, 15 vehicles #1 A-Loop, #2 Kimble Point, #3 Loder Point, #4 Beach, #5 E-Loop Shelter
Redwood Group Camp	\$60/night, (15 Primitive Sites, Maximum of 120 people, & 30 vehicles)

### CAMPING PROCEDURES

---

**RESERVATIONS:**

1. Proceed to your reserved site.
2. Have reservation number available for proof of payment.

**WALK-IN'S:**

1. Select Campsite
2. Reservations are not posted. Do not set up on site until payment is made.
3. Visit [www.recreation.gov](http://www.recreation.gov) or call 1-877-444-6777 to check for availability and pay for camping fees. Only credit/debit cards are accepted
4. Write down your reservation number for proof of payment and set up on campsite

### A Friendly Reminder While Staying at Kanopolis Lake

1. Reservations are no longer posted at the campsite. See Camping Procedures.
2. All dogs, cats, and other pets must be kept on a leash that is six feet maximum in length. Owners are responsible for removing any and all pet waste.
3. Quiet hours are from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. Day use ends at 10 p.m. Generator operation is prohibited during quiet hours.
4. All vehicles must park on the provided gravel pads. A minimum of 2 wheels of each vehicle must remain on the gravel pad. Additional gravel parking areas are designated in each loop.
5. Campsites must be kept clean at all times. Fire rings must remain free of trash prior to departure.
6. Improper dumping of gray water (i.e. wastewater from sinks, dish washing etc.) is prohibited. Please dispose of gray water properly at provided dump stations.
7. All vehicles used in the parks shall be operated in accordance with Federal and State law. ATV's, golf carts, unregistered motorcycles, unregistered motor/electric scooters, go-peds, etc. are prohibited.
8. Picnic tables and fire rings must remain at designated locations. All fires shall be contained inside of fire rings and must be extinguished prior to departure.
9. Fireworks are not permitted on any Federal property.
