Tuttle Creek Cove Park Rules & Regulations

Thank you for choosing Tuttle Creek Lake for your outdoor recreation experience. We hope your visit is safe and enjoyable. The following is a list of rules to assist you during your stay. Not all rules are listed, for a full list refer to Title 36. A copy of Title 36 is post on bulletin boards or can be obtained from the camp hosts or park rangers. The camp ground host and park ranger are always happy to answer any questions.

Camping



HOW TO GET A SITE

1. Proceed to a campsite that is not occupied or marked as reserved (reservations are marked on the site post)
2. Set up your camping equipment.
3. Stop at the self pay station and follow the posted instructions to pay for a campsite.
4. Make payment and place provided permit on site post within 1 hour. Do not leave the campground without paying first. Payment can be made with cash/ check at the self pay station. Credit card is accepted during booth hours.

1. Camping is allowed only on designated sites. Sites are designated by numbered site posts.
2. All campers must stop at the park entrance to register/pay for a campsite within 1 hour of set-up..
3. You must be 18 or older to register for a site. The site holder is responsible for the actions of those at their site and must occupy the site each night of the stay. Site transfers must be identified with a new permit/envelope.
4. Each campsite allows a maximum of **8 persons (including visitors)**, and three camping units: two of which must be a tent.
5. A camping unit is defined as a tent, trailer, pop up, (continued...)

...RV or pickup topper designed by the manufacture for overnight accommodation. Child play tents, tarps, hammocks etc. are not camping units.

6. Wheeled units must remain on gravel surfaces. Tents may be placed anywhere in the grass immediately surrounding the campsite (**some sites do not accommodate multiple large units or a lot of vehicles/boat trailers**).
7. Placement of items on a campsite for future occupancy (illegal reservation) is prohibited. Vacant sites may not be used for additional parking.
8. Check-out time is 5:00 p.m. Extensions must be paid and permitted before this time. Remove all equipment from site upon check-out.
9. Check-in time is 6:00 p.m. or sooner if the previous occupant has vacated the site.

Day Users & Visitors

1. Day users may use unreserved campsites for picnics of limited duration (2 hour max) at no charge.
2. Day use hours are 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Visitors found in the park outside these times are subject to fine and eviction.
3. Boaters are permitted to use the ramp for overnight launching and retrieval activities.
4. Visitors who wish to stay overnight must complete the following before 10:00 p.m.
 - Pay for a campsite and display a permit.
 - Establish a campsite by placing a legal camping unit on the site (see #5 under Camping). Visitors may not sleep in their vehicles.

Vehicles



1. Do not park vehicles in the grass (or what should be grass). Four wheels must remain on paved/ gravel surfaces. Parking permitted at designated spaces only.
2. **Overflow parking is available at the boat launch. Only two vehicles allowed at a campsite.**

3. Boat trailers may be parked on the grass.
4. Unlicensed motorized vehicles (golf carts, scooters, ATVs, etc.) must remain trailered and cannot be operated in the park.

Pets



1. Dogs and cats are permitted and must be kept on a leash (six feet or less), caged, or physically restrained at all times. Do not place chains around trees.
2. Pets are not permitted in public buildings, including restrooms.
3. Pets cannot be left unattended at your site, in your camper, or vehicle.
4. Loud and continuous barking will not be tolerated.
5. Cleanup immediately after your pet.

Special Restrictions



1. Quiet hours are from 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. Excessive noise is prohibited at all times
2. Fires are permitted only in grills and rings provided. Ground fires are not permitted. Don't leave fires unattended!
3. Collection of firewood that is dead AND down is permitted. Lanterns are not to be hung so as to damage trees or limbs. Nails, axes, etc. are not to be driven into trees.
4. Fireworks are prohibited.
5. Loaded firearms and other projectile firing devices (bows, sling shots, paintball/pellet guns, etc.) are not allowed in the park.
6. Keep sites free of trash and litter. Deposit all trash in dumpster provided prior to departure. Remove all refuse from grills.
7. Grey water and other liquid wastes must be contained and disposed of at the dump station. Do not wash dishes or other articles at hydrants.





Tips to Keep Your Kids Safe

- It only takes 20 seconds for a child to drowned
- Watch kids in and around water without being distracted.
 - Teach kids how to swim in open water, which is different from swimming in a pool.
 - Use a U.S. Coast Guard– approved life jacket appropriate for the child’s weight and water activity.
 - Learn what to do in an emergency without putting yourself at risk of drowning.
 - Expect the unexpected. Plan for the known and the unknown.

Life Jacket Loner Station
